

The reflective quality is a mirror that always and only shows "ourselves" in a society where "more and more" means full of material things, but also "more and more" emptiness of oneself. As a result, the people talk about nothing – only empty debates and discussions.

Tutto pronto per la XVIII edizione di Miniartextil, la mostra internazionale d'arte tessile contemporanea, che si terrà a Como dal 27 settembre al 16 novembre, prima di toccare altre quattro città europee. Filo conduttore della kermesse di quest'anno sarà "Matrix natura", una fonte di ispirazione che ha caratterizzato in particolare l'arte di quest'ultimo anno, come sottolinea Luciano Caramel, il critico d'arte comasco curatore della mostra e membro della giuria, che ha selezionato 54 minitessili, tra le 456 adesioni pervenute da artisti di 51 nazioni.

E dato il tema di questa edizione non poteva mancare la collaborazione con il Wwf, che ha visto l'evento culturale come l'opportunità adeguata per valorizzare la natura, al di là delle banalizzazioni correnti. E la natura presente nelle opere dei partecipanti, per lo più giovani e ben rappresentati anche dal panorama maschile, che in questa edizione ha voluto sfatare la tendenza tutta al femminile, è talvolta imponente.

Curiosa e originale, ad esempio l'opera della francese Marie-Noëlle Fontan: un tessuto di 50 metri di lunghezza, realizzato con erbe ed elementi vegetali trovati durante le passeggiate, accostati in modo contrastante, che troverà spazio nella exchiesa di San Francesco, location lariana della kermesse insieme con il Broletto, il Museo "Giovio" e la Camera di Commercio. Presente tra i prodotti artistici anche la tecnologia, con un dvd olandese che, nella complessità della sua interpretazione, vuole sottolineare i cambiamenti storici e geologici che la Terra, in quanto organismo vitale, ha subito nel corso della sua evoluzione. La maggior parte delle opere esposte saranno in tema, la natura è l'elemento portante ma non dà un titolo alla mostra, Questo perché, rimarca sempre Caramel, «la natura in arte può avere ruoli diversi». Sunday's final round looked to be all Morita, who was last season's money-list title holder, but only for a few holes. Rattled, she began losing it, as did second round co-leader Ritsuko Ryu, who bogeyed three of her last five holes on the front nine to falter. Monta was fighting to stay relevant, shrugging off challenges from groups playing ahead of her, but Sattayabanphot began making her move late on the front nine,


Concept:


Etruscan Jewelry

The Etruscan civilization was first recorded in the 8th century B.C. and dominated Roman civilization in the 6th cenbury B.C. (infoplease.com). Although most of its remnants are now lost, the historical and ethnic jewelry has survived. With distinct designs in beauty found in the land and people, Etruscan jewelry still requires the ancient techniques, which are actively practiced today through the venerable goldsmiths who teach this knowledge in the Tuscan region. For example, in order to do a fusion of the metals, cuttlefish bones are used in the process.

Customized Designs

Concept: Whenever I custom-design a piece of jewelry, the customer usually finds me through the recommendation of another client. When we meet, we converse about his/her thoughts and inspirations in life. Through our personal discussions, I can see their inner qualities, which I then transform into the material. I usually present several sketches, from which the client selects. Expressing the signature inner quality of each client connects me to him/her on a deeper level. At the time of final presentation, I truly enjoy the lead-up and to see their reactions of the completed piece. Here are a few samples of my personal favorite customized designs throughout the past twenty years of my career.




CUSTOMIZATION D: AQUAMARINE RING
